Despite all the research, every one of us catches cold and most of us catch it frequently. Our failure to control one of the commonest of all ailments sometimes seems ridiculous. Medical science regularly practices transplant surgery and has rid whole countries of such killing diseases such as Typhus and the Plague. But the problem of the common cold is unusually difficult and much has yet to be done to solve it.

It is known that cold is caused by me of a number of viral infections that affect the lining of the nose and other passages leading to the lungs, but the confuring variety of viruses makes study and remedy very difficult. It was shown in 1960 that many typical colds in adults are caused by one or the other of a family of virus known as rhinovious, yet there still remain many colds for which no virus has yet been isolated.

There in also the difficulty that because they are so much smaller than the bacteria which cause many other infections, viruses cannot be seen with ordinary miscrocopes. Nor can they be cultivated easily in the bacteriologist's laboratory, since they only grown within the living cells of animals or plants. An important recent step forward, however, is the development of the technique of tissue culture, in which bits of animals tissue are enabled to go on living and to multiply independently of the body. This has greatly aided virus research and has led to the

discovery of a large number of viruses. Their existence had previously been not only unknown but even unsuspected.

The fact that we can catch cold repeatedly creates another difficulty. Usually, a virus strikes only once and leaves the victim immune to further attacks. Still we do not gain immunity from colds. Why? It may possibly be due to the fact that while other viruses get into the bloodstream where antibodies can oppose them, the viruses causing cold attack cells only on the surface. Or it may be that immunity from one of the many different viruses does not guarantee protection from all the others. It seems therefore, that we are likely to have to suffer colds for some time yet.



For many years now the governments have been planning the eradication of child labour in hazardous industries in India. But the truth in that despite all the rhetoric, no government so far as succeeded in eradicating this evil, nor has any been able to ensure compulsory primary education for every Indian Child. Between 60 and 100 million children are still at work instead of going to school and around 10 million are working in hazardous industries. India has the biggest child population of 380 million in the world plus the largest number of children who are forced to earn a living.

We have many laws that ban child - labour in hazardous industries. According to the child labour (Prohibition and Regulation) Act 1986, the employment of children below the age of 14 in hazardous occupations has been strictly banned. But each state has different rules regarding the minimum ge of employment. This makes implements of these laws difficult.

Also, there is no ban on child labour in non-hazardous occupations. The Act applies to the organized or factory sector and not the unorganized or informal sector where most children find employment as clearness, servants, porters, waiters etc. Among other forms of unskilled work. Thus, child - labour continues because the implementation of the existing laws is tax.

There are industries, which have a special demand for child-labour because of their nimble fingers, high level of concentration and capacity to work hard at abysmally low wages. The carpet industry in UP and Kashmir employs children to make hand knotted carpets. There are 80,000 child workers in Jammu and

Kashmir alone. In Kashmir because of the political unrest, children are forced to work while many schools are shut. Industries like gem cutting and polishing pottery and glass want to remain competitive by employing children.

Children working in hazardous industries are prone to debilitating diseases which can cripple them for life. By sitting in cramped, damp and unhygienic spaces, their limbs become deformed for life. Inside matchstick, fire-works and glass industries they are victims of bronchial diseases and T.B. their mental and physical development is permanently impaired by long hours of work. Once trapped, they can't get out of this vicious circle of poverty. They remain uneducated and powerless. Finally in later years, they too are compelled to send their own children to work, child-labour perpetuates its own nightmare.

If at all the government was serious about granting children their rights, an intensive effort ought to have been made to implement the supreme court's directive of 1997 which laid down punitive action against employers of child labour only compulsory primary education can eliminate child labour.

Effective speaking depends on effective listening. It taxes energy to concentrate on hearing and concentrate on understanding what has been heard.

Incompetent listeners fail in a number of ways. First, they may drifts from what the speaker in saying. Second, they may counter. They find counter arguments to whatever the speaker may be saying. Third, they complete. They they filter. They exclude from their understanding those parts of the message which do not readily fit in with their own frame of reference. Finally, they react. They let personal feelings about speaker or subject override the significance of the message which is being sent.

What can a listener do to be more effective? The first key to effective listening in the art of concentration. If a listener positively wishes to concentrate on receiving the message, his chances of success are high. It may need determination. Some speakers are difficult to follow, either because of voice problems or because of the form in which they send the message. There is then particular need for the determination of a listener to concentrate on that is being said.

Concentration is helped by alertness. Mental alertness is helped by physical alertness. It is not simply physical fitness, but also positioning of the body, the limbs and head. Some people also find it helpful to their concentration if they hold the head slightly to one side. One useful way for achieving this is intensive note - making, by trying to capture the critical headings and sub-headings the speaker in referring to.



Note taking has been recommended as an aid to the listener. It also helps the speaker. It gives him confidence when he sees that listeners are sufficiently interested to take notes; the patterns of eye-contact when the note taker looks up can be very positive; the speaker's timing is aided - he can see when a note - taker in writing hard and can then make effective use of pauses.

as you experience them. It is an unconditional experience where you receive as much as you give you can explain yourself to a friend openly without the fear of hurting a family member. 

At a press conference Tuesday in Oslo, Malala said that in many parts of the world, children's requirements are infinitely more modest than an ipad or computer. "What they are asking for is just a book, just a pen, so why can't we give that?"

The pairing of Malala and Satyarthi had the extra symbolism of linking neighbouring countries that have been in conflict for decades. After

she was named as the winner, Malala said she wanted both states' Prime Ministers to attend the prize - giving ceremony in Oslo.

While Malala will be the star of the annual Nobel extravaganza also featuring the literature prize winner, Frenchman Patrick Modrano, and his compatriot Jean Tirole with the economics and award her peace prize co-winner satyarthi is less high profile. He welcomed the increased attention the Nobel brought to the cause of children in bonded labour. "There are children who are bought and sold like animals", the jovial 6-year old, clad in traditional Indian dress, told reporters at the Nobel Institute.
